





MONTHLY SUMMARY

In the final lead-up to the US presidential election, global shares dipped 0.9% in October, still a 33% rally in the MSCI World Index over the past year. For Australian investors, the decline in the Australian Dollar (AUD), most notably by 5.6% against the USD, helped support offshore returns. Japan's Nikkei 225 Index was the only major market to rise, alongside Yen weakness, while Europe, China, Australia and the US saw declines. Events included US presidential campaign noise, ongoing retaliatory strikes in the Middle East, policy rate cuts by several central banks, economic data releases supporting US growth expectations and a plethora of companies reporting quarterly results. Long-term interest rates in the US and other major markets tended to rise, given some elevated concern about lack of fiscal restraint by governments and even as many central banks reduced cash rates. The data suggests that recession risks are low and loosening monetary conditions bode well for corporate outlooks. The US 10-year bond yield finished October 50bp higher at 4.28%. Within the markets, Financials (+2.1%), Communication Services (+2.0%) and Energy (+1.5%) showed strength, while Health Care (-3.9%), Materials (-3.7%) and Real Estate (-3.4%) fell.

The portfolio experienced a decline in USD terms and a rise in AUD. The portfolio's gains were led by Netflix, SAP and Visa, each rising over 5% due to excellent quarterly results and positive outlooks, with Visa addressing the recent overhang of regulatory uncertainty. Despite supportive 3Q24 results for most portfolio companies, some share prices pulled back as they consolidated previous strong gains. The portfolio's weaker performers included ASML, L'Oréal, LVMH and HCA Healthcare, all of which dropped over 10% in the month. The portfolio impact of L'Oréal and LVMH was minimal due to modest position sizes as earnings growth slows from above-trend levels. ASML reported strong 3Q24 results but cut its 2025 revenue guidance from €30-40Bn to €30-35Bn, which surprised investors given the robust demand backlog. This cut mainly reflects capital spending cuts by major customers, Intel and Samsung, delaying near-term demand for ASML's equipment. ASML's Capital Markets Day on 14 November will update its growth projections (from those provided in 2022, prior to Gen AI) for the years, not months, ahead.
